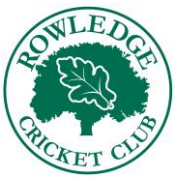

Our volunteers.... Mega thanks....but what's next?

For 20 years' I have had the pleasure of organising our junior cricket.

I have never taken for granted the fantastic support from our parent volunteers, it takes over 1500 sessions a year to run our club. Just last year 11 dads went on the ECB coaching course thus securing the junior section. This year our girls section flourishes largely underpinned by the great help from a group of our Mums.

In addition, our group of 20 qualified ECB coaches do a fantastic job for our youngsters.

Our Committee do so much other work for us all.

I am constantly amazed that our busy members find time to help BUT...

Over the years running our club has become an increasing complex management task to provide high level coaching, match organisation and a safe playing environment.

I know it appears we are always asking for help but to continue our success we must get help from parents. We currently need help in these areas:

- Junior Fixture administrator-. To co-ordinate youth match pitch availability. This takes about 1 to 2 hours a week from April onwards
- BBQ support- To order and collect Friday Night BBQ food on a weekly basis. This is 30 mins a week from May to end July.
- Junior Kit organiser- to ensure our junior kit is sufficient for the coaches. This is a task in April and about an hour a month during the season.
- Planning coach cover on Friday nights- about 20 mins a week during the season.
- Sweets Friday Organiser in 2018 season when Jennie steps down next year.

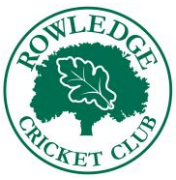
Second Hand Face book Page

Please do make him feel welcome when you see him around the club.



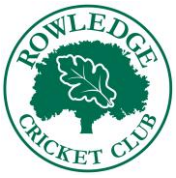

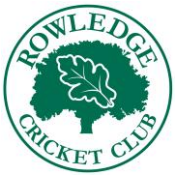

Wise & Co. Owing a furnished holiday home

Owners of properties that are let as furnished holiday accommodation can benefit from a range of tax reliefs. These reliefs are based on the lettings period, rather than the use of the property, so more properties may be eligible for these tax reliefs than is commonly thought.

At its simplest, this type of property let is treated for most tax purposes as a trading venture. The letting rules are relatively simple: the property must be available for commercial letting to the public for at least 210 days in a 12-month period. It must actually be let for at least 105 days in that 12-month period. The first of these rules is reasonably easy to comply with, and the second is usually met by those owners actively marketing a holiday let, but may be more difficult for those simply letting a property in a non-holiday location. It is usually advisable not to let your property for more than 31 consecutive days, as this can reduce the opportunity for tax relief.

Owners may also be unaware that they can claim capital allowances for all the equipment used in the holiday let. For new equipment purposes, such as white goods, furniture and any moveable items, the cost can be up to £200,000, which can be deducted from the net profits of your trading business for that period.

There are also advantageous capital gains tax (CGT) benefits for owners of furnished lets:

- When you sell your furnished property let, any capital gain arising can benefit for 'roll over relief' where the proceeds are reinvested into another property intended as a furnished let, or into any other asset used for a trading purpose.
- Furnished holiday lets are also excluded from the restriction to mortgage interest relief which came in on 6 April 2017
- Your property is treated as a business asset, so if you give the property away – maybe as part of your inheritance tax

- Planning – the capital gain can be held over to the recipient, which results in no CGT arising on the gift.
- Entrepreneurs' relief is also available on the disposal of a furnished holiday letting business. This reduces the rate of CGT to 10%.
